Understand the Key Documents Involved in Your Real Estate Closing

1. Closing Disclosure (CD) or Settlement Statement

- What It Is A detailed breakdown of your loan terms, costs, fees, taxes, and credits related to the purchase.
- Who Signs Buyer, Seller, and sometimes Lender.
- When You Get It At least 3 business days before closing.

2. Lender Documents

- What They Are A collection of forms provided by your lender.
- Includes Loan disclosures, legal notices, and required compliance forms.
- Who Signs Buyer.

3. Promissory Note

- What It Is A written promise to repay your mortgage loan under specific terms.
- Includes Loan amount, interest rate, and repayment schedule.
- Who Signs Buyer.

4. Deed of Trust

- What It Is Secures the Promissory Note using the property as collateral.
- Who Signs Buyer.
- **Important** Allows the lender to foreclose if the loan is not repaid.

5. Tax Proration Agreement

- What It Is An agreement dividing current year property taxes between buyer and seller.
- Why It Matters Ensures each party pays their fair share based on the closing date.
- Who Signs Buyer and Seller.

6. Texas Disclosure Form T-64

- What It Is A state-required form summarizing the financial details of the transaction.
- Why It Matters Helps maintain transparency and compliance with Texas regulations.
- Who Signs Buyer and Seller.

7. Waiver of Inspection

- What They Are A buyer's acknowledgment of declining a final walk-through or additional inspections.
- Why It Matters Confirms the buyer accepts the property condition as-is.
- Who Signs Buyer.

8. Other Notices or Disclosures

- What They Are Signed acknowledgements of other information regarding the transaction or parties involved. Will vary based on transaction specifics.
- Purpose To disclose all pertinent information and confirm information accuracy.
